At Cheverly, Meryland:

On 17 May 1961, a live address was established for Gladys G. DANBHINT at (5611 Jason Street), Cheverly) Maryland, through the cooperation of Dr. Edward A) and (Anne B. SALLOCM) householder at that address.

On the sees date, Mrs. (BALLOCM) her daughter, (Patricia) and son, George, vero briefed to the effect that they should accept any cables, latters, telegrams or telephone calls for Mrs. DAMBRUMT. In the event any inquiries were received concerning Mrs. DAMBRUMT, they were to advise that Mrs. DAMBRUMT was residing with them but that she was not available at the moment. They were to determine who was calling and the purpose of the call. If the call was from the cable or telegraph office, Mrs. (SALLOCM) or Patricia) was to call back later as Mrs. DAMBRUMT and receive the message and request delivery of the written cable or telegram. In the event the inquiry was from any other source, they were to contact the Reporting Agent inseediately.

The case individuals were further briefed, in general, as to why Mrs. DAMERUAT was supposedly residing with them and why she was expecting some form of communication. They were informed that Mrs. WARRANT was the mother of Eustace H. DAMERUAT, who was being held a prisoner by a foreign government. The mother has sent a cable to her som asking how he is, whether he needs anything, inquiring if there is anything she can do for him, and asking him to please communicate with her. She is now awaiting and expecting some form of reply from him.

On the following day, 18 May 1961, Dr. (SALIOH) was contacted. The above information had been related to him by Mrs. (SALIOH) at the request of the Reporting Agent. (O Dr. (SALIOM) was requested to notify the (Cheverly) and the Myattsville Post Offices that Mrs. DARMHUM was residing at his home and any mail received for her should be delivered to his address.

On 22 May 1961, Dr. (SALLOCK) was again contacted end he advised that he had personally called the Postmistress at the (Cheverly) Post Office regarding delivery of May. IMPRIMAT'S wail and had requested

bor, in turn, to notify the (Hyattsville) Post Office.

Dr. (BALICOM) is a well-known (Washington dentist). He maintained an office at (810 "H" Street, H.E) for a number of years until he of was drafted into military service. He served in the Army as a demtist and upon his release, as a Lieutenant Colonel, he re-opened (his private practice with an office at (1035 "I" Street, H.W.) For a number of years he was on the Staff of Georgetown University as 08 cm instructor of Contistry in the Georgetown Dental School of He has resided in Chayerly Maryland for at least the past twenty years, previously at 2016 Laurel Avenue and currently at (5611 08 Isseen Street). His daughter, (Patricia) is attending Maryland University. His son, (George), is attending (St. John's College Migh School.

Daily contact was maintained with Dr. (SALICH) on 22, 23 and 24 May 1961. As of the latter date, no occasion had as yet been received for Mrs. DAMRENT.

On 18 May 1961, a Western Union Telegram was sent to Eustace DARRHUMT, Reclusorio Macional, Mueva Gerona, Isla de Pinos, Cuba. A copy of this telegram is attached as Exhibit #1.
